




Moravcsik Gyula and his pupils in Eötvös Collegium ca. 1935/36



# Mészáros Tamás

### Preparations for a new critical edition of Laonikos Chalkokondyles' *Histories*

The work can contribute several partial results to (1) a new edition of Laonikos Chalkokondyles' *Histories* in accordance with the principles of modern textual criticism. Scientific novelties can be expected mostly in connection with the textual tradition (the examination of previously neglected manuscripts, suggestions concerning different readings), and

We wish to examine (2) the textual connections between Laonikos and his literary models (Thucydides), which can also throw a light on (3) the practice, manner and aim of the treatment of sources in late Byzantine historiography. The Byzantine studies in Hungary, having a long-established tradition, may benefit from the results of (4) the Laonikos research in relation to Hungarian history, in the course of which we may also expect (5) a Laonikos translation with excerpts.



# Kovács István

He is studying a codex (Harley 5735) from the second half of the 14th c. written in ancient Greek and containing rhetorical exercises, mostly epistolary models.
